Costume designer Deborah Nadoolman Landis is an Academy Award® nominee whose work is represented in the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. Her credits include such notable films as “Animal House,” “The Blues Brothers” and “Coming to America.” Among the iconic costumes she has created are Michael Jackson’s red jacket in “Thriller” and Harrison Ford’s leather jacket and fedora in “Raiders of the Lost Ark.”

Dr. Landis holds an M.F.A. degree in costume design from the UCLA School of Theater, Film & Television and a Ph.D. in the history of design from the Royal College of Art in London. In 2009, she was named founding director of the David C. Copley Center for the Study of Costume Design at UCLA, where she also holds the David C. Copley Chair.


